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Explanation of Results:

The rules about scorecards from Book 3 - Target Archery, Chapter 14 Scoring from the World Archery rulebook:
 14.4 Scorecards shall be signed by the scorer and the athlete, indicating that the athlete agrees with the value of each arrow, the sum total, the number of 10's and the number of X's (or 9's for indoors). If the scorer is participating in the shooting, his scorecard shall be signed by another athlete on the same target butt.
 14.4.1 Each target will have two scorecards, one of which may be electronic. If there is a discrepancy in the arrow values between an electronic and a paper scorecards, the paper card will take precedence.
 The organizers are not required to accept or record scorecards that have not been signed, and/or do not contain the sum total, and/or number of 10's and/or the number of X's (or 9s for indoor) and/or which contain mathematical errors. The organizers or officials are not required to verify the accuracy of any submitted scorecard; however, if the organisers or the officials note an error, they will correct such error and the result as corrected will stand.

The scoresheets were subsequently reviewed on Sunday, October 11, 2015. The methodology of reporting the final scores for "Shoot Out Autism" by the tournament official are as follows, keeping in mind that this is a "learning" tournament, an opportunity for archers to learn all the various aspects of tournament participation and in particular, scorekeeping:

Some of the scores are highlighted in pink, with an arrow going up or down. These scores were calculated incorrectly. The highlighted scores with arrows going up indicate the score was too low, with arrows going down the score was too high. The most common mistakes were "carrying over" in the tens when adding.

If the reported total was *less* than the adjusted total, the final score is the score reported by the archer. It will *not* be adjusted upwards, even if it means that the archer may have placed higher in the rankings and possibly affected the medal outcome. While this might seem punitive at first, archers must take responsibility for their scores; if they believe their scores will be *fixed* by the tournament official, there is no incentive for the archer to take the care necessary to turn in the correct scores to begin with.

If the reported total was *more* than the adjusted total, the final score is the adjusted total as calculated by the tournament official. The reason that the adjusted total is recorded as the final score is because it is unfair to the other archers who have turned in accurate scores--the Shoot Out Autism officials feel that no archer should gain an advantage score-wise by submitting a score higher than the one they actually earned.

If one or more archers submits a higher score than they have earned and that difference affects placement awards, a reasonable effort by the tournament official will be taken to redistribute the awards via mail.

NOTE: It turns out that none of the corrections affected the medals awarded to archers for Shoot Out Autism.

We hope this tutorial will highlight the importance of each archer's responsibility for accurate scorekeeping--nobody wants any archer to be disappointed with the results because of inaccurate scores! Each archer (or archer's parent) needs to check the scorecard totals, *regardless of who did the calculating*. If there is a discrepancy, the archer should go back to the score-keeper(s) and remedy the totals before the scorecards are turned in.
